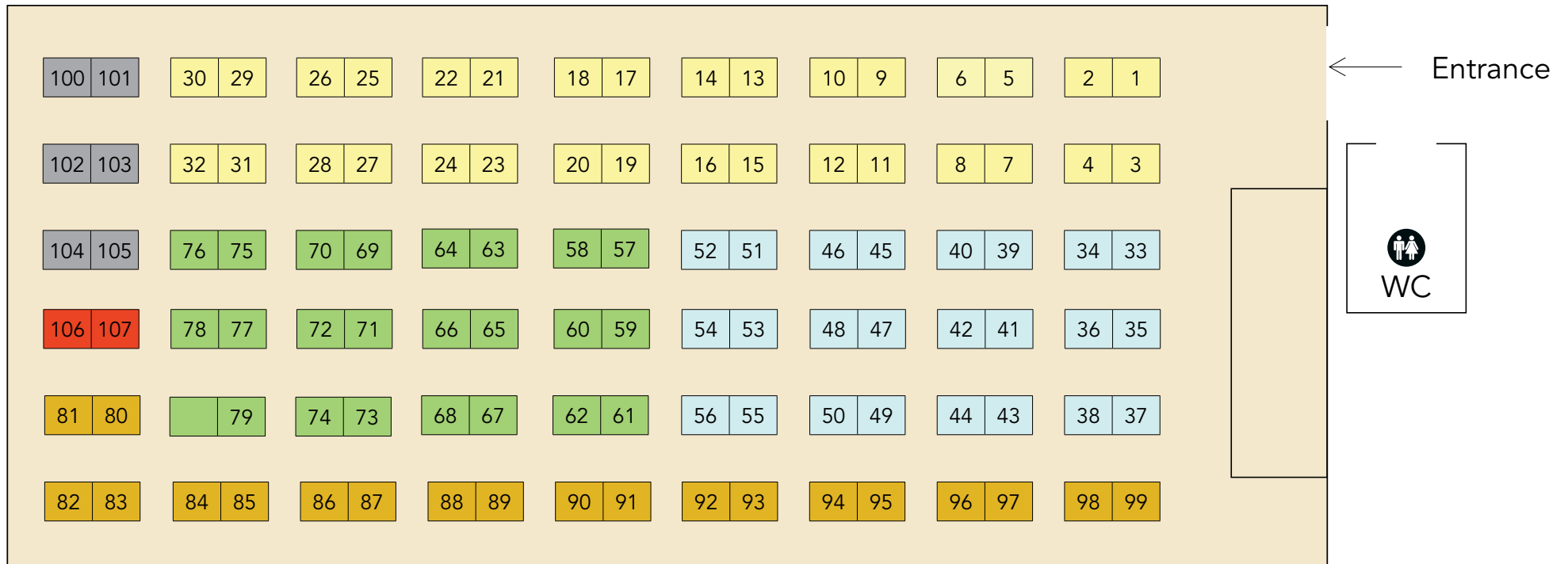

## SALONE HOFER



The Salone Hofer, inside the Grand Hotel Des Alpes, takes the name from the painter Gottfried Hofer, who painted the walls of the great parlour inside, between 1897 and 1898. At the time it was the dining room for Princess Sissi and the Emperor Franz Josef Österreichischer, who purchased the alpine resort of Madonna di Campiglio some years before.

The most famous painting by Hofer is the large canvas on the entrance wall, based on a purely imaginative subject, depicts young shepherds that once inhabited these places paying homage to a gentle, modest Madonna with Child against a backdrop of the Brenta Dolomites as seen from the slopes of Monte Spinale. The Princess stayed in Madonna di Campiglio twice, in 1889 and 1894, finding solace from her anguish in long walks accompanied by a mountain guide in Vallesinella on the Grotte mountain and Monte Spinale, which was her favourite because of the lush greenery and the aura of mystery surrounding it.
